I am adaptable in transferring the skills of finding, critically evaluating, and deploying information to daily life and work

I am willing to take personal responsibility for finding the information I need

I am curious about my subject and have a desire to learn and understand more

I am familiar with the range and use of different search tools and how they influence search results and adapt accordingly

I am critical in my approach to information

I understand how information/evidence is used in my subject and in future professional life

I select and use different search tools, recognising the differences between them and their benefits and limitations

I identify, select and use a wide range of key print and digital sources appropriate to the discipline, from the Library and beyond

I assess different print and digital formats and select the ones relevant to my current context and need

I ask questions about what I find to be sure that information is accurate, authoritative and relevant to my search

I scope research questions clearly and define searches with parameters that allow me to find information needed to address them

I adapt my search approach according to the information need and search results, recognising that it is not enough to rely on familiar sources

I define search strategies by identifying suitable keywords and limits and by making use of background information relevant to the topic

I make full use of my personal network and subject-specific expert help to find information sources

I identify what I don't know and actively seek new information to fill the gaps in my knowledge

I can construct strategies and complex searches appropriate to digital and print content I can identify subject-specific collections of information such as gateways and portals

I can use search engines, catalogues, databases and abstract and indexing services

I can recognise the range of digital media available and know how to handle different document types and file formats

I can assess current knowledge and identify gaps

I can identify keywords, limit searches by particular parameters and use advanced techniques such as boolean searching, wildcards and truncation

I can plan and organise an information task

I can distinguish between trusted sources online and in print and less reliable sources

I know how print materials are organised in the library

I can locate sources of full text information, both online and print, and download where applicable

I can use controlled vocabularies and taxonomies

I am aware that not all information is reliable

I can apply appropriate evaluation criteria to determine the quality of information found

I have access to specialist search tools for my discipline

I have access to learning resources, guides and tutorials

I have access to trusted information sources

I have access to full text information in print and digital form

I have access to teaching sessions on information and digital literacy

I have access to experts to help me find information sources I have access to search engines and other search tools

I am aware of the different types and formats of information that are available

I am aware that there are gaps in my knowledge

I am aware of the importance of accurate, current and relevant information

I am aware that access to information may not always be immediate and I may need to order sources or visit other libraries.
